New Business:

- APCOM Generator cost for Preventative Maintenance increase to \$250 effective in 2023. D. Bass-motion to approve increase, and budget for 2023, J. Hankiewicz-seconded, motion carried 5-0-0
- LCRC invoice for Fire Station signage for 8 Mile Rd. L. Fitz was requested to purchase two road signs from LCRC and have the LCRC install them, that has been the policy, but now has changed. LCRC billed for signs and labor/materials, etc. in the amount of \$510.84. K. Fickies-motion to pay LCRC \$510.84, J. Hankiewicz-seconded, roll call vote, motion carried 5-0-0
- L. Fitz-motion to make Budget Amendment \$500 from General Fund to 101-449-930 Road Signage, K. Fickiesseconded, motion carried
- LCRC bill for Road Brining for 2022, L. Fitz-motion to pay LCRC in the amount of \$6,923.13, J. Hankiewicz-seconded, motion carried 5-0-0
- LCRC for Asphalt approaches bill for \$41,645.48. Discussion on overage. Original quote was for \$38,796.64 for 3 double approaches. K. Fickies-motion to pay \$38,796.64 out of ARPA Funds to the LCRC for asphalt approaches, B. Myers-seconded. Discussion. Roll call vote, motion carried 4-1-0
- Letter from LCRC for projects for 2023, asking for list of projects by Dec. 1, 2022. Projects outstanding top dressing of Toma Trail, and 11 Mile to Bear Track which was the \$27,000 matching monies for 2022, Lou will get LCRC to put into writing that their \$27,000 will carry over. D. Bass requested a meeting with LCRC to go over issues. L. Fitz-motion to postpone any action on this request for the list of projects for 2023 construction year and ask for an extension from 12/1/22 through our meeting 12/13/2022 and invite the Road Commission to come here for that meeting, B. Myers-seconded, motion carried 5-0-0
- Four plastic chairs for SEEFD Support Staff, K. Fickies-motion to L. Fitz \$89.52, B. Myers-seconded, roll call vote, motion carried 4-0-1
